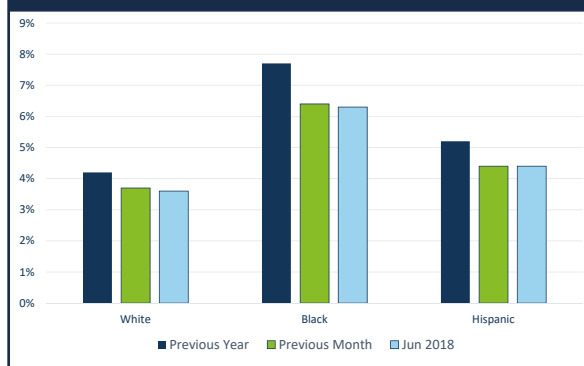

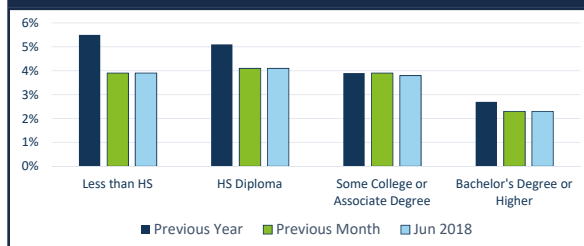
### Highlights

- The unemployment rate for males declined by 1.2 percentage points over the year to a rate of 3.8 percent, while the rate for women decreased by two-tenths of a percentage point to 4.2 percent.
- The veteran unemployment rate over the month decreased by one-tenth of a percentage point to 3.5 percent.
- Individuals with some College education or associate degree had an unemployment rate of 3.8 percent. Those with a Bachelor's degree or higher had a 2.3 percent unemployment rate and those with a High School Diploma had a rate of 4.1 percent.
- Of the new entrants into Texas' labor force in June, more were women (23,000) than men (21,800).
- Out of the estimated 7,713,300 Texans not in the labor force, about 95 percent do not currently want a job.
